In the Course Description- Please refer to Professor Lee's comment. Last sentence seems cut off. Reword for clarity. Prerequisite course does not need to be mentioned and removal will save words for the 80 word count limit. Your course description in Form A should match exactly what you submit in the syllabus. ELO's- Consider modifying ELO's to better reflect upper levels of Bloom's Taxonomy. Consider using an ELO generator to help. <https://learning-objectives.easygenerator.com/> and <https://teachonline.asu.edu/objectives-builder/> are great resources.
