Briefly describe the program proposal (new or change) and provide a justification:

Primarily, with this proposal we are asking for a change in the minimum number of units required for Early Fieldwork in School Psychology (currently designated with the prefix EDS 439A and EDS 439B). We are asking to increase the minimum number of units required for Early Fieldwork in School Psychology from the current "2 - 5" units to the proposed "3 - 5" units (this would also change the minimum number of "Total Units" from 89 to 91 units).

Justification: The need for this change is generated by the fact that the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC; new standards attached) has increased the minimum number of preschool through grade 12 field-based practicum hours from 200 to 300 (effective with the 2022-23 academic year). Our program proposes to exceed this minimum requirement by 25 hours and would require students to complete a minimum of 325 hours of early fieldwork.

Also, with this proposal we are asking for changes that:

1. Make catalog language consistent with CCTC language changes. Specifically, the "internship in school psychology" is now referred to as a "School Psychology Internship Program." Note that this is a terminology change only and does not change any aspect of the internship.

Justification: "School Psychology Internship Program" is the correct term.

2. Make catalog language consistent with the previous degree elevation, which changed "MA in Education (School Psychology)," to "MA in School Psychology."

Justification: "MA in School Psychology" has been the correct degree designation since a degree elevation was previously approved, yet this change was not reflected here.

3. Add catalog language (i.e., "Admission Requirements") that directs the reader to the Ed.S. in School Psychology for details regarding admission.

Justification: Such is not in the current catalog and has created some confusion among applicants.

4. Add catalog language (i.e., "Admission Requirements") that clarifies who is eligible to apply for this credential program.

Justification: Such is not in the current catalog and has created some confusion among applicants.

5. Make some minor grammar corrections and wording changes.

Justification: Better ensure catalog language is accurate.

Program Description

The Pupil Personnel Services School Psychology Endorsement Credential is administered by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC). California State University, Sacramento, is accredited by the CCTC to award this credential to students meeting program requirements. The credential is required to practice as a school psychologist in the state of California. Possession of the MA in School Psychology or its equivalent, and the Pupil Personnel Services School Psychology Endorsement Credential also prepares an individual to meet the academic requirements for California's Licensed Educational Psychologist license administered by the Board of Behavioral Science Examiners, California Department of Consumer Affairs.

Unique strengths of the program include supervised training in a clinic setting, early field experience that includes a minimum 325-hour field placement in public school settings, and instruction by faculty who hold school psychology credentials.

The program also offers a School Psychology Internship Program. The internship is typically paid and interns are selected by employing districts. Students are not eligible for the School Psychology Internship Program until they are ready to register for EDS 441A, Internship in School Psychology. For the full time student this usually occurs in the fifth semester of the program. A minimum 1,200-hour internship, completed in not more than four semesters, is required and must be approved by the School Psychology Program's Internship Coordinator.

Admission Requirements: Course prerequisites and other criteria for admission of students to the degree major program, and for their continuation in it.

See Admission Requirements for the Ed.S. in School Psychology. They are the admission requirements used for the Pupil Personnel Services School Psychology Endorsement Credential. Only those applicants who already have a graduate degree are eligible for stand alone admission to this credential program. All other applicants must apply for the Ed.S. in School Psychology program to obtain this credential.
