59% of them are female.

41% of them are male.

71% were Hispanic/Latinx.

25.2% were freshmen.

Key Performance Indicators

Fall 2018 (n=7968)

Average Term GPA was 2.90.

Average Unit Load was 13.47.

88% of students were full-time.

45% of students were enrolled with 15 units or more.

94% of students were in good academic standing.

98% of students persisted the following semester.

Spring 2019 (n=8486)

Average Term GPA was 2.86.

Average Unit Load was 13.16.

87% of students were full-time.

41% of students were enrolled with 15 units or more.

93% of students were in good academic standing.

96% of students persisted the following semester.

Other Indicators

- 85% of high unit DEGREES seniors applied for graduation while 79% of high unit Non-DEGREES seniors applied for graduation.
- 45% of second year DEGREES students were enrolled in 15 units or more for spring 2019 while 43% of second year Non-DEGREES students were enrolled in 15 units or more for spring 2019.
- 24% of DEGREES students with 60 units or more registered for WPJ while 27% of Non-DEGREES students with 60 units or more registered for WPJ.
