Who we are

A two-week residential program for migrant high school students providing the information and tools necessary to pursue a college career and be competitive candidates for admission to a four-year institution.

MSLI Goals

MSLI helps students understand:

1. Admission requirements to be admitted to a four-year institution
2. Multiple pathways to college
3. How to finance a college education
4. The social, health and economic benefits of a college degree
5. Their own values, goals, personal assets and challenges
6. The difference between college and high school
7. How to identify and utilize campus resources and services
8. How to build a strategic network of mentors
9. The importance of civic engagement, service learning and leadership
10. Introduction to careers in science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics (STEAM)

Gender

55% of them are female.

45% of them are male.

Class Level

3% of them were 9th graders.

38% of them were 10th graders.

32% of them were 11th graders.

28% of them were 12th graders.

Overall Outcomes

100% of participants rated their overall MSLL experience positively (excellent, great, and good).
83% of MSLL students who graduated high school from 2011-2014 were enrolled in some form of college.

46% of them pursued a field in STEAM.

Academic Competency Outcomes

Pre and Post Assessment in English Course

1. Sentence Transitions – from 55% to 82%
2. Vocabulary - from 35% to 75%
3. Commas Usage – from 55% to 78%
4. Sentence Editing – from 52% to 72%

Pre and Post Assessment in Math Course

1. Linear Equation – from 45% to 50%
2. Quadratic Equation - from 53% to 73%
3. Percentages – from 8% to 35%
4. Probability – from 4% to 25%
5. Budgeting – from 19% to 38%

Pre and Post Assessment in College Preparedness

1. CA Higher Education Opportunities – from 38% to 90%
2. College Requirements – from 8% to 51%
3. GPA Requirements – from 8% to 80%
4. Grants – from 65% to 84%
5. Scholarships – from 70% to 82%
6. Federal Work Study – from 75% to 90%
7. Loans – from 81% to 85%
