### Who We Are

The Food Pantry provides food and basic necessities to Sac State students in need and aims to decrease the impact food insecurities have on the academic success of our students.

2035 users for academic year 2019-2020

## Demographics of Students for AY 2019-2020

### Gender

64% of students were females.

35% of students were males.

1% of students were non-binary.

### Ethnicity

36% of students were Hispanic/Latinx.

24% of students were Asian/Pacific Islander.

11% of students were "Other."

18% of students were White.

10% of students were Black/African American.

1% of students were Native American.

### College Level

18% of them were freshmen.

15% of them were sophomores.

25% of them were juniors.

34% of them were seniors.

9% of them were graduate students.

99 students from Psychology

61 Undeclared students

60 students from Biology

60 students from Sociology

54 students from Communication Studies

1395 – family members of students were also receiving food from the pantry for AY 18-19.

1636 – family members of students were also receiving food from the pantry for AY 19-20.

## Survey Results

### How long have you been dealing with food insecurity?

58% of respondents said 1-3 months.

18% of respondents said 3-6 months.

9% of respondents said 6 months – 1 year.

15% or respondents said over 12 months.

*Note: The USDA defines food insecurity as having “limited or uncertain access to nutritious and safe foods because of a lack of money and other resources.”*

### In the last 30 days, how many days did you cut the size of your meals because there wasn't enough money for food?

7% of respondents said 0 days.

50% of respondents said 1-5 days.

27% of respondents said 6-10 days.

12% of respondents said 11-20 days.

4% of respondents said 21-30 days.

### How did you learn about the ASI Food Pantry?

26% of respondents said word of mouth.

18% of respondents were returning user from last year.

17% of respondents said Sac State website.

11% of respondents said ASI website.

10% of respondents said Social Media.

8% of respondents said Student Health & Counseling Services (SHCS)

8% of respondents said Other.

3% of respondents said CARES.
