- b. 17,490 students attended different programs and events in AY 19-20 compared to 15,336 students in AY 18-19
 - c. First Destination Survey for Graduating Students (N=1,595)
 - i. 89% were graduating with a bachelors' degree
 - ii. 71% were looking for work in the Sacramento area
 - iii. 73% were confident of being employed within the next 6 months
 - iv. Primary status after graduation
 1. 27% employed in a field that is related to career goal
 2. 23% seeking employment
 3. 14% planning to continue education but not yet enrolled
 4. 11% expecting to be employed in the next 6 months
